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At a meeting in the Swiss village of Schleitheim in 1527, a group of Anabaptists found agreement on key points of doctrine and practice.

## Their agreement, written by Michael Sattler and called the Schleitheim Confession, had seven articles.

- 1. Baptism is for those who have experienced repentance and forgiveness of sins through Christ, and desire to follow Him in righteousness.
- 2. Faithfulness must be maintained in the church, by excommunication—the ban—if necessary.
- 3. The Lord's Supper is a ceremony of remembrance of Christ's sacrifice, and is for the united, pure church.

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- 4. The church is holy, but the world is evil; the church must keep itself separate from the world.
- 5. The church must choose godly leaders.
- 6. Violence—the sword—must not be used for any reason by Christ's followers.
- 7. In obedience to Christ, Christians must not swear oaths.

  The Schleitheim Confession gave form and unity to a large part of the Anabaptist movement, and continues to do so today.

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
