1 The Global Church

While Europe and North America grew more secular in the 20th century, Christianity grew rapidly in Asia, Latin America, and Africa; this growth shows no signs of stopping.

2 Asia

- Christianity has been especially successful in China, India, and South Korea.
 - The Chinese church is growing enormously in spite of government opposition.
 - Most of this growth is in underground house churches.
 - Persecution of Chinese Christians can be severe, but is relatively mild in some regions.

- In India, the church is growing in spite of sometimes violent opposition from Hindus.
- South Korea may soon become the first large Asian country with a Christian majority.



- Most Christians in Latin America are Roman Catholics.
- Pentecostal churches, in particular, have been hugely successful in Latin America.
 - Pentecostalism is the most rapidly growing branch of Christianity today in Latin America and throughout the world.

5 📃 Africa

- Africa is especially noted for its native denominations with few or no ties to Christian movements in Europe and North America.
- These churches often lean toward Pentecostalism.
- They often include elements of non-Christian religions.

6 Challenges

• As European and American missionaries have spread Christianity around the world, and as native Christians have assumed leadership after the departure of missionaries, several challenges have emerged.
