1 Early Church Leaders

2 Justin Martyr (c.100-c.165)

- Justin followed some of the most popular Greek and Roman philosophies before converting to Christianity around 130.
 - Justin continued to appreciate much of this philosophy, especially Platonism.
 - Justin used the language and concepts of philosophy to defend Christianity and attack paganism and heresy.
- Justin was martyred in Rome c.150.

3 Irenaeus

(c.130-c.202)

- Irenaeus was a bishop in Gaul.
- Irenaeus taught that salvation is a restoration of God's plan for humanity.
 - Besides being God, Christ was a perfect man just as Adam was created as a perfect man.
 - Through faith in Christ, man can be restored to this perfection.
- · Irenaeus taught against heresy.

4 Tertullian (c.160-c.225)

- · Raised in Carthage, North Africa
- · Son of a Roman centurion
- Trained as a lawyer and converted to Christianity c.198

5 Teachings of Tertullian

- · Taught against Judaism, paganism, and heresy
- Defended Christians against persecution and rumors
- Critical of Greek philosophy and its influence on Christians
 - "What has Athens to do with Jerusalem?"
- Concerned with practical matters
 - Strict church discipline
 - High moral standards
- Placed high value on tradition and authority

6 Origen (185-254)

- A popular Greek-educated teacher from Alexandria
- Taught all day and studied the Bible all night
- Died as a result of torture during persecution

7 Teachings of Origen

- Highly influenced by Plato
- Taught that the Bible has both a literal meaning and an allegorical meaning
- Devised a complex theory of the history of the universe

• Opposed heresy, but was himself declared a heretic by some
