# GRADES 7 & 8 WORLD GEOGRAPHY

Geography is the study of the "where" of human life. This course, World Geography, gives you an enormous "learned by heart" resource: a confident knowledge of the world's basic political and physical geography. In World Geography, you will form a mental picture of the world's spaces, learn ways to talk and think about the world's geography, and memorize and draw the world's physical and political features. Throughout your life, you will access these resources; they will provide a framework for understanding events around the globe and how they affect your life and the lives of earth's 7.9 billion people.

The course culminates with a final project: drawing a map of the world, including its countries and key physical features, from memory.

### AT A GLANCE

EVERY DAY MATTERS. World Geography is a cumulative course. This means that the work you do each day builds the knowledge and skills you need for the final project.

World Geography features six units focusing on a continent or region. Within these units, you will become proficient with atlas use and map reading, you will produce and deliver presentations on specific countries, and you will draw a map of the unit's continent or region from memory. Almost every day, you will practice drawing a continent or piece of a continent. This practice builds memory of each country's shape and location and of each continent or region's important physical features.

# **OBJECTIVES**

## IN WORLD GEOGRAPHY, YOU WILL ...

- ★ Recall key geography terms
- ★ Apply the five themes of geography: movement, region, location, interaction, and place
- ★ Interpret thematic maps
- ★ Read maps which vary in scale, symbols, and projections
- ★ Locate places and physical features using both latitude and longitude coordinates and alpha-numeric grids
- ★ Specify places and physical features using latitude and longitude
- ★ Specify places and physical features relative to other places or physical features
- ★ Identify significant land and water features
- ★ Identify selected political features (cities, states, provinces)
- ★ Present summaries of the geography, history, and culture of two selected countries
- Present a digital poster of a major city focused on the five themes of geography.
- ★ Draw, from memory, a political/physical map of the world, including countries and selected water and land features

## **ASSESSMENT & GRADES**

- Quizzes will be given on vocabulary, atlas use, geography concepts, and the application of those concepts.
- Tests will be administered after Units 2-7. Tests will consist of drawing, from memory, the current continent or region.
- Country Presentations will be graded on content, organization, requirements for visual elements, and presentation.
- "Mapping the World by Heart", the final project of drawing a world map from memory, will take three to four weeks and will be the ultimate assessment for the course.


